Another core responsibility is software development on the technical basis of PsychOpen Gold (Open Journal System, OJS) to implement innovative features for scientific journals.

- Bachelor-level degree or higher in information science, psychology or other relevant field
- Good knowledge of OJS and its workflow management
- First experience with web development (e.g. PHP, HTML, CSS, web and mail servers). Knowledge in OJS programming is a plus.
- Competence in project planning, presentation to non-technical audiences, implementation and controlling
